Back to School Campaign

Because of you, \$3,214 was raised to help fund these endeavors:

- Mental and behavioral health therapy for more than 1,000 Scott County students.
- The Phoenix Day Treatment Program for emotionally and behaviorally disturbed students referred from the 14 Illinois School Districts.
- Programs that help youth navigate peer pressure, relationships, and prevent teen pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections.
- An afterschool Therapeutic Recreation Program that helps youth learn social and anger management skills.

Program Spotlight: Behavioral Health Intervention Services (BHIS)

Expressing feelings and solving problems can be a challenge for all of us. Preschoolers can have an especially difficult time with this, and if there's an underlying mental or behavioral health issue, it often carries over to the classroom, resulting in yelling, hitting, and other disruptive behaviors.

It's estimated that up to 60% of students do not receive the treatment they need due to stigma and lack of access to services. Of those who do get help, nearly two-thirds do so only in school. Virtually every community has a school that can serve as an ideal context for prevention, intervention, positive development, and regular communication between school and families.



Bethany is thankful to work in collaboration with the Rock Island County 708 Mental Health Board and the East Moline School District to provide behavioral intervention for at-risk preschoolers.



Rosa Almanza, the Bethany Interventionist, is pictured center above. She identifies children with challenging behaviors early so children are less likely later in life to engage in criminal activity, abuse substances, or commit suicide, and more likely to respond appropriately socially and perform better in school. Resources are also provided to parents.
