## **Program Spotlight: Foster Care**

Foster care is temporary care. The goal is to reunite the child with his or her birth parents or relatives whenever possible. Matching the needs of each child to the special strengths of each foster

family is another major consideration. When locating a foster care placement, the child's home community is first considered so the child may attend the same school. Permanency is achieved through Return Home, Adoption, Guardianship, or Independence. The length of time a child will be placed in a foster home will vary for each situation, but the goal is for a child to be in foster care as short a time as possible.

The Foster Care program at Bethany for Children & Families serves Rock Island, Henry, and Mercer counties. Foster Care services are supported 24 hours a day by experienced case managers and master's-level supervisors. Bethany has an on-call system to take cases, make placements, and respond to family needs and emergencies.

There is a continual need for foster parents. Being a foster parent requires a lot of patience and understanding. All children need the love and support of a family so they can grow into healthy productive



members of the community! Each person has many strengths and skills and can make a unique contribution to a child's life. If you are interested in learning about being a foster parent, please contact Lynn Lohman-Anderson at (309) 797-7700.

# **Congratulations on Graduating**



In January 2018, Markus graduated from the Bethany-Black Hawk Phoenix Day Treatment Program.

The Phoenix Program assists students between the ages of 11 and 22 who have demonstrated severe behavioral and emotional problems and who have been unsuccessful in their home school districts. The program offers special education

services, case management services, and interventions to area youth.

Neal Shipley, a case worker for Bethany, said he's proud of how far Markus has come. "When Markus began here," Neal said, "he was very behind academically, had a history of missing numerous days of school, basically admitted he was riding his time until he could drop out when he turned 17, but fortunately, he didn't give up and decided to give us and himself a chance."

Markus' story is truly inspiring! No matter how many obstacles were thrown in his way, he didn't give up!

"No one can put you down. You're the only one who can," said Markus. "You have the choice of getting back up or staying down."

# **TRP Carnival Day**

The Therapeutic Recreation Program is an after-school program designed for at-risk youth between the ages of eight and 17. The program examines use of leisure and recreational activities in a constructive way and provides anger management training with an emphasis on developing positive social relationships.

TRP provides a safe and nurturing recreational and learning environment in which staff members challenge troubled youth to replace problematic behaviors with appropriate social skills. Increased emotional and social competency allows them to succeed not only in their educational settings, but also at home and in the community.

#### **Give Kids a Smile**

Bethany is a proud supporter of National Children's Dental Health Month, which occurs each year in February with the goal of highlighting the benefits of good dental health care.

The Give Kids a Smile Mobile Dental Program provides preventative and restorative care to children who do not have access to dental health care. Licensed dental staff members provide services in the mobile dental clinic, which travels to schools in Rock Island, Henry, and Mercer counties in Illinois and Scott, Jackson, and Clinton counties in Iowa.

#### Give Kids a Smile has provided dental services to 18,097 children on the mobile dental clinic between 2011 and 2017.
