BRAIN HEALTH ROOM AT PHOENIX SCHOOL

The Bethany Phoenix Day Treatment Program has a new Brain Health Retreat Room this school year. The room is decorated in calming colors and features sensory items. It's designed to promote emotional well-being and provide a safe space for students and staff to step back, decompress, and get the support they need. It is a place where student's feelings, thoughts, and problems are accepted without judgment and where students are encouraged to learn new, self-regulating techniques. The room is staffed by a Master's level employee.

The room was developed in collaboration with Brain Health Now, a grassroots organization dedicated to ending the stigma surrounding mental illness. Brain Health Now is sponsoring for the room as well as providing healthy food for the children and staff who utilize it.


